Business Practice: Reporting on Joint Program Enrollment

There are several academic programs at U-M that are jointly offered by two or more schools or colleges. The information system (Peoplesoft) does not associate these programs with a school or college. As of the 2016-17 academic year, the following are active joint programs:

Academic Program	School / College	Degree
Health Informatics	School of Information School of Public Health	Master (MHI)
Interarts Performance	School of Art & Design School of Music, Theatre, & Dance	Bachelor (BFA)

Admissions to the following joint program were closed in the fall of 2014:

Academic Program	School / College	Degree
Entrepreneurship	School of Business College of Engineering	Master (MsE)

When reporting on enrollment, students should be reported in each of the two schools or colleges, but only once at the aggregate university level.

When reporting on student credit hours where the student's program is the basis, credit hours should be reported in each of the two schools and colleges of the joint program, but unduplicated at the aggregate university level.

When reporting on student credit hours where the department of instruction is the basis, credit hours should be reported in the school or college in which the course is administered regardless of the student's program.

Impact of this business practice

Within the Office of Institutional Research, reports will be evaluated regarding the current calculation and modified if found not to be in compliance with this business practice.

Document Action

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Note: February 22, 2018 – In the FY2019 budget narrative there is an indication that the joint aspect of this program may be ended. Individually, there are no plans to end the degrees, just the joint aspect.
