Provider Relief Funds (PRF): \$1,106,976 was awarded to the School of Dentistry for personal protection equipment used in clinics.

Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA): \$1,201,204 disaster assistance reimbursement for various protective measures implemented on campus including the cost of supplies and materials, rental equipment, and workforce time/labor.
